



Transfer Admission Policy

Transferring into the Diagnostic Medical Sonography or Nuclear Medicine program is a multi-step process. Admission decisions lead to either direct acceptance to the major or require a period of residency as an intended major.

DIRECT ACCEPTANCE TO THE PROGRAM

Your application for direct acceptance to either of the two programs will be considered only if your GPA at your current institution (*or your overall GPA, if you have attended multiple institutions*) is 2.7 or higher; and you have completed the majority of the pre-requisite courses with a minimum grade of “C” or better (all pre-requisites must be completed prior to the start of the program). Once meeting these requirements, students are eligible for an interview with program faculty. Meeting all of the requirements does not guarantee admission to either program.

NON-DIRECT ACCEPTANCE TO THE PROGRAM

- A student who has not completed the required pre-requisites or achieved a 2.7 GPA may be admitted to Regis College as an intended Diagnostic Medical Sonography or Nuclear Medicine major. The student will complete all pre-requisite courses during what is called a Period of Residency.
- If you have taken any of the pre-requisite courses, you must have achieved a grade of “C” or better in each of the courses. However, completion of pre-requisite courses is not required for admission to the College.
- During the Period of Residency, a student must maintain a GPA of 2.7 or higher and achieve a grade of “C” or better in each of the pre-requisite courses.
- Intended majors will be interviewed by the program faculty members for formal admission to the major during each fall semester.

Final decision of acceptance into both Regis College and the major is usually made within one week of the interview. Decisions are based on academic performance and the interview, as well as program capacity.
