□ Complete Financial Aid Process

- Upon acceptance to Regis, students are automatically considered for a variety of merit scholarships. To apply for federal and need-based aid, students should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at **studentaid.gov** and add the Regis College school code, **002206**
- Master Promissory Note (MPN) and Entrance Counseling: Students who are offered Federal Direct Student Loans (subsidized or unsubsidized) must complete a Master Promissory Note and Entrance Counseling at studentaid.gov if they wish to receive the funds.

Complete Math Placement Test and Writing Assessment Through Moodle (If Applicable)

- Moodle is a system used at Regis to foster online communication between a course instructor and students. Instructors use Moodle to post the course syllabus, assignments, due dates, and general course announcements.
- More information will be sent to the email address you included on your application to Regis if you're expected to complete the math placement test and writing assessment. The math placement test will assist in determining your course schedule for the fall semester. The writing assessment will help your first year writing instructor create a learning experience that can set you up for success.

□ Complete Course Registration Process

If You will receive instructions on how to sign up for an Advising and Course Selection (ACS) appointment from the Office of Academic Advising after completing your math placement test. □ Complete Medical Forms

• Massachusetts law requires all incoming students provide proof of immunization, have a physical exam prior to arrival on campus, and complete their health forms. Regis College has collaborated with CastleBranch, a compliance management company to provide you a secure account to manage your time-sensitive school requirements.
