However, the client told me that I had made the difference this time around in their sobriety. They told me that my empathic understanding, unconditional positive regard, and willingness to commit to helping them on a regular basis enabled them to conjure up the courage to make meaningful changes in their life!"

Based on her experience, Kirstie offers some inspirational advice for fellow Regis students, soon to be graduates, and alumni. Here, in random order, are 5 of her takeaways:

5: Trust your gut and the energy you feel from potential employers when selecting a job.

4: Process your decision-making when selecting a job with people that support you and have your best interests in mind.

3: Know what your non-negotiables are when you are selecting a job.

2: Interview *them*! Come prepared to interviews with a list of questions - employers love when you ask *them* good questions!
1: Don't sell yourself short. Always know how valuable you are and believe that anyone would be lucky to have you.
