Application for Graduation

Deadline: April 8

If you anticipate completing your degree requirements this academic year, you must complete the Graduation Application on [RegisHub](#). **Completing this form will initiate the degree audit review by the Registrar's Office for possible graduation and is the official list used for all Commencement activities.**

You can find the application on the main page of [RegisHub](#). When choosing the completion term on the application, this is the term when you will be finishing all your degree requirements. Once you submit the application, you will receive a confirmation email. If you do not receive a confirmation, please resubmit your application through [RegisHub](#). You can go back to review or update your application through RegisHub up to one month before your anticipated completion date. If you need to make changes after that, please contact the [Registrar's Office](#).

If you anticipate completing your requirements this spring semester, you must complete the application before April 8.

Academic Regalia Orders

Academic regalia (cap, gown and hood) is an important ceremonial part of Commencement. The cost of regalia is included in the graduation fee for master's students, while doctoral students purchase their regalia. Place your order online [here](#).

Have you ever been working on a research assignment and run into an article that says “Request from Interlibrary loan”? Although the library subscribes to 68 different databases, which provide access to millions of resources, you will still encounter articles that are not immediately available through the library. As many of you may know, these articles will need to be requested through our interlibrary loan service (ILL). ILL is a great way to obtain journal articles that are not available in the library’s collection. Here are a few things to keep in mind when using ILL:

- Always remember your timeline! ILL operates from Monday morning through Friday afternoon. Any requests that are submitted on Friday evening or on the weekend will not be addressed until Monday morning. We usually estimate that it will take around 3 business days for a request to be fulfilled, but it’s often closer to 1-2 business days.
- If you’re working on a deadline (e.g., a mid-week discussion post), try using the “Full Text” or “Regis Library Has It” filters to limit your search results to materials that are available right away!
- Check Google Scholar first! Sometimes the article will be available online despite not being in our collection. You can check to see if an article is available by copying-and-pasting the title into the search box on Google Scholar. If there’s a link to a PDF or HTML copy of the article, you can skip the wait!
- Once you receive your requested article, make sure to print or download it right away. You will receive a link that provides access to the article for only 30 days and for a limited number of views. However, once you download or print the article, it is yours to keep!
