

# REGIS PRESIDENTIAL CATHOLIC SCHOOLS SCHOLARSHIP

**NOMINATION FORM: FALL 2021** 

The Regis College Presidential Catholic Schools Scholarship is a full-tuition, four-year (fall and spring semester) undergraduate scholarship for residential students who demonstrate the values of the Sisters of Saint Joseph of Boston. These values include:

- Gracious hospitality
- Love and service of the Dear Neighbor without distinction
- Peaceful resolution of conflict
- Care for all God's creation

Regis College Presidential Catholic Schools Scholarship recipients must live on campus, maintain good academic status, and remain full-time students. The Regis College Presidential Catholic Schools Scholarship is available to recipients no more than eight (8) semesters of undergraduate study. Regis College Presidential Catholic Schools Scholarship recipients will convene throughout the academic year and participate in ongoing co-curricular activities.

## **Eligibility**

To be eligible for the Regis College Presidential Catholic Schools Scholarship a student must:

- 1. Have a cumulative recalculated high school Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.7. The Regis College Office of Undergraduate Admission recalculates GPAs on a weighted 4.0 scale.
- 2. Attend a Catholic high school
- 3. Apply for undergraduate admission as a first year via Early Action no later than January 1st, 2021.
- 4. Intend to be a residential student (living on campus).
- 5. Students applying to the Regis Fast Track 3 Year Program are not eligible to apply for this scholarship.

Regis will not consider students who do not satisfy these criteria.

#### **Application**

Eligible students may for the Regis Presidential Catholic Schools Scholarship will participate in the following process:

- 1. Have their principal, headmaster, or guidance counselor complete a Nomination Form by January 1st, 2021.
- 2. Eligible students will be asked to complete a 2-3 page essay responding to a writing prompt due back with the recommendation form on January  $1^{st}$ , 2021.
- 3. In January 2021, the Regis Presidential Catholic Schools Scholarship Committee will make an initial selection of eligible students based on their nomination, admission application, and written reflection. Selected students will move forward to the interview process.
- 4. Member(s) of the Regis Presidential Catholic Schools Scholarship Committee will interview (in person or virtually) selected eligible students.
- 5. The Regis Presidential Catholic Schools Scholarship Committee will make final selections for the Regis Presidential Catholic Schools Scholarship from the group of interviewed students.
