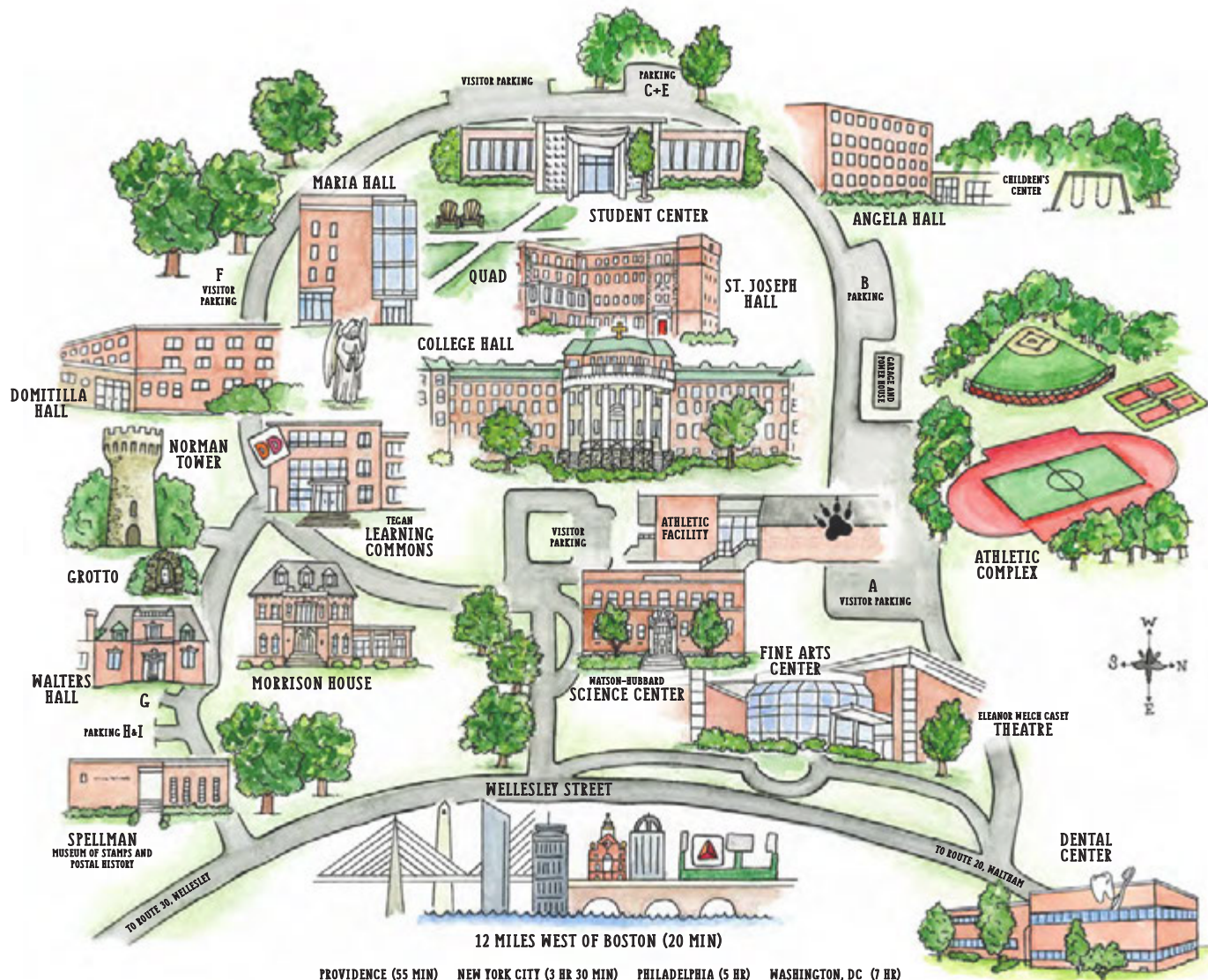

Next Steps Checklist

☐ Explore SPIKE: Regis' Student Portal

- Log in with the Regis credentials sent to you by Information Technology Services (ITS).
- SPIKE is your one-stop shop for Regis Resources including links to:
 - » **Regis Email:** Email communication from Regis
 - » **Moodle:** Online portal for placement exams and course portal
 - » **Regis Hub:** Online portal to view your financial aid package, student bill, grades, and update your emergency contact information
 - » **Housing Portal:** Online portal to complete your housing application, select your roommate or fill out a roommate preference form, and select your dining plan

☐ Complete the Financial Aid Process

- Upon admission to Regis, students are automatically considered for a variety of merit scholarships. To apply for federal and need-based aid, students are required to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at **studentaid.gov** and add the Regis College school code, **002206**
- Inform the Office of Student Accounts of any outside scholarships by emailing **student.accounts@regiscollege.edu**

☐ Obtain Your Student ID Card

- To obtain your Student ID Card, you will need to email **ids@regiscollege.edu** with the following information:
 - » Subject Line: 'Request for Student ID Card' and include your first and last name.
 - » Attach a headshot photo in the format of a .jpeg or .jpg.
 - » Your headshot photo must be in color and taken in full view, with only your face.

☐ Complete Math Placement Test and Writing Assessment

- Students will be notified to complete these assessments. The math placement test will assist in determining your course schedule for the fall semester. The writing assessment will help your first-year writing instructor create a learning experience that can prepare you for success. Both assessments are located on Moodle.

☐ Sign Up for an Advising Appointment

- After completing your math placement test, a link will appear in Moodle which will direct you to sign up for an Advising and Course Selection (ACS) appointment, which are offered in selected weeks from April until August. At this appointment you will review your fall course schedule and have the opportunity to ask any questions about your first semester at Regis.

❑ Send in Your Transcripts by July 15 and Advanced Placement (AP) Scores by Aug 1

- Final high school or college transcripts should be sent to the Office of Undergraduate Admission.

❑ Register for On-Campus Housing

- Complete the housing application on the Housing Portal beginning June 9.
- Select your roommate or fill out a roommate preference form to be matched.
- Housing assignments and roommate information will be available by early August.
- Select your dining plan on the Housing Portal after you receive your housing assignment.

❑ Pay Your Student Bill

- All student bills are posted to hub.regiscollege.edu
For first semester undergraduate students a paper statement will be mailed to your address on file in late June. Tuition bills are due by August 10, 2025.
- For future semesters, students will receive their bills via Regis Hub. Please contact Student Accounts with any questions, or to develop a payment plan, at **781.768.7270** or student.accounts@regiscollege.edu

❑ Complete Medical Forms by July 15

- Massachusetts State Law requires all incoming undergraduate students to provide proof of immunizations and medical insurance information. Additionally, Regis College requires that students have a physical exam within the last 12 months, prior to arrival on campus.
- The Center for Health and Wellness will email all incoming students, using their Regis College email address, and will provide detailed instructions on how to complete and upload the health forms.

❑ Enroll in or Waive Student Health Insurance

- The Commonwealth of Massachusetts requires all students to have health insurance. Regis offers a student health insurance plan for all students who do not have outside coverage.
- If you do not waive the health insurance during the waiver period, you will automatically be enrolled in the program and responsible for the health insurance fee.
