- [RAFT – Residential Assistance for Families in Transition](#)
 - **RAFT** provides short-term financial assistance to low-income families who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. RAFT can provide up to \$7,000 per household within 12 months to help preserve current housing or move to new housing.
- **CHAMP** (Common Housing Application for Massachusetts Programs) - Subsidized Housing: <https://publichousingapplication.ocd.state.ma.us/>
 - You can apply to multiple communities/housing authorities at once. Federally funded Housing requires a separate application from the individual housing authorities.
 - State-aided public Housing
 - Massachusetts Rental Voucher Program (MRVP)
 - Alternative Housing Voucher Program (AHVP)
- **Bridge over Troubled Waters:** services for homeless, runaway, and at-risk youth. <https://bridgeotw.org/>

- **Mass Housing Navigator** - <https://housingnavigatorma.org/>
 - Listings include information that helps answer affordability and eligibility questions.
 - For the most affordable rentals, look for "Rent Based on Income."
 - For older adult communities, use the "age-restricted" filter.

- **CCFA** – Child Care Financial Assistance (EEC) [Massachusetts Government+1](#)
 - This is run by the Massachusetts Department of Early Education and Care (EEC).
 - Helps families pay for childcare or out-of-school time programs.
 - Eligibility depends on income, household size, etc.
 - If you're a family, apply early. In many cases, there is a centralized waitlist. [Mass 211+1](#)
- **Child Care Choices of Boston (CCCB)** – childcare referral & support.
 - Based in Boston, it helps families find childcare and helps families/providers with subsidy/voucher [Child Care Choices of Boston+1](#)
 - If you live in the Boston area, contact them to help navigate the options, find openings, and check which programs accept subsidies.
