Founders' Day Promoted Good Trouble

We celebrated our Founders' Day on Thursday, September 24. This annual tradition marks the arrival of the Sisters of St. Joseph to Boston in 1837. Typically, the day pays homage to the Sisters' core value of serving "the dear neighbor without distinction" as students, faculty, and staff perform community service in the Greater Boston area, Weston, and Lawrence. Health and safety guidelines related to the ongoing pandemic prevented the Regis community from going out, so the day was spent looking inward.


Civic Engagement Initiatives
